- Good knowledge of outdoors

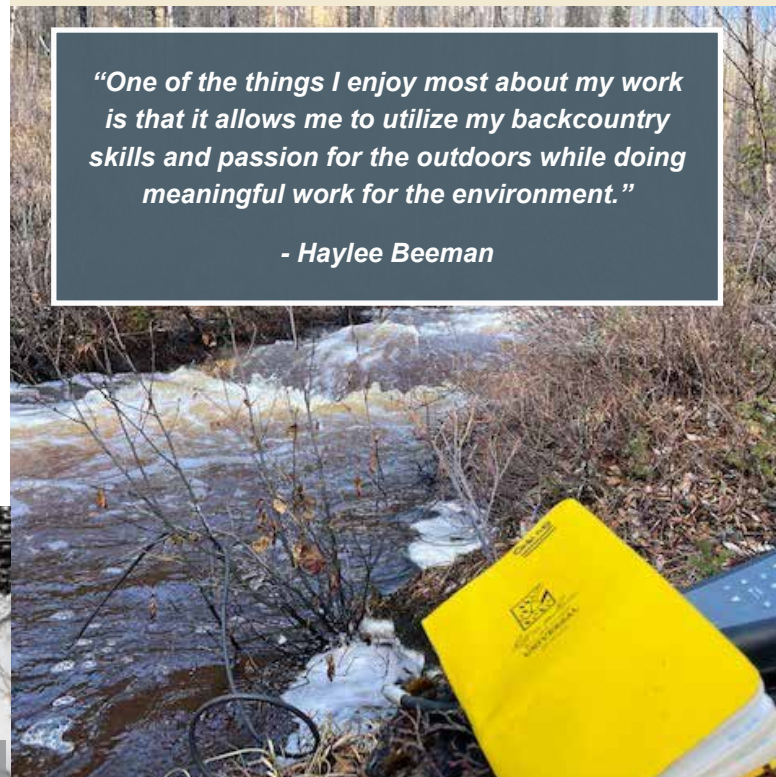
